As Group Managing Director, leading the members of the Board of Directors of the SWGR Group of Companies, I am committed to ensuring that the SWGR Group work activities are carried out safey at all times.

By impelemtation of this policy SW Global Resourcing Ltd contributes to: achieving a high standard of safety and risk management for our road vehicle fleet and authorised drivers; providing information to employees, contractors and suppliers on what actions are needed to reduce or remove road risk on business journeys; the avoidance of unnecessary journeys made by road; and SWGR's goal of making sure that everyone is Safe Together.

SWGR's principles for the management of occupational road risk are as follows: implementation of a company-wide system to facilitate the principles of Safe Driver; provision of a fleet of company vehicles which are selected, inspected, managed and maintained to deliver the principle of Safe Vehicle; and introduction of technological solutions to deliver the principle of Safe Journey

The aim of this Policy is to reduce vehicle incident and at-fault work related road collision costs and injuries by 50% over three years by promoting a safe driving culture within the organisation.

The main objectives of this policy are:

- 1. To reduce the number of accidents Our employees may be involved in
- 2. To make drivers aware of the main risks they face or create when driving for work
- 3. To make sure that employees who drive vehicles in the course of their work demonstrate safe, efficient driving skills and other good road safety habits at all times
- 4. To maintain all company vehicles in a safe, clean and roadworthy condition to ensure the maximum safety of the drivers, occupants and other road users, and reduce the impacts of company vehicles on the environment – this also applies to personal vehicles used for work purposes.

The following actions in company vehicles will be viewed as serious breaches of conduct and dismissal may be a consequence:

- 1. drinking or being under the influence of drugs while driving
- 2. driving while disqualified or not correctly licensed
- 3. reckless or dangerous driving causing death or injury
- 4. failing to stop after a collision
- 5. acquiring penalty points leading to suspension of licence

Company vehicles are expensive items of business equipment that must be maintained in a legal, road worthy condition at all times. Every driver of a Company vehicle is required to read this document and become familiar with the various sections.
